Welcome to GP Strategies Apprenticeships' Learning Hub

The Learning Hub with GP Strategies Training Apprenticeships is an online learning environment that allows you to locate learning materials and activities related to your studies and programme induction from any location with internet access, including access via a mobile device.

Use the step-by-step instructions below on how to access the resources within the Learning Hub.

Step 1.

Watch the video provided within the welcome email. Take time to look through the tabs at the top of the Learning Hub page. It is important that you understand what information can be found within each tab. There are 7 tabs within the Learning Hub. These are: home, my learning learner support, technical support, policies and procedures, cognassist and login/logout.

If your Skills Coach asked you what tab you need to access to find information on the free NUS Apprentice Extra Card, offered by GP Strategies Apprenticeships; would you know?



Step 2.

Once you have watched the tutorial video and spent time looking through the system, it is recommended that you go to the 'My Learning' tab to access your resources.

As you are studying Early Years Educator Apprenticeship, you will be assigned 2 apprenticeship programmes:

1. GP Strategies Induction Programme
2. Early Years Educator

Step 3.

You must complete the GP Strategies Induction programme.

This programme includes everything you need to know about Safeguarding, Mental Health, and Wellbeing, Preventing Extremism and Radicalisation, and Personal Development.

You should take time to read the content, complete the e-learning courses and modules.

Once you are satisfied that you are confident with the content, take the quiz and send your certificate to your Skills Coach.

Your Skills Coach will also check your understanding on this content during their first visit.

Step 4.

Over the course of your apprenticeship you will develop knowledge, skills and behaviours. These will be gained through a combination of off-the-job training and practical experience in your workplace. This is a key component of the apprenticeship and you will need to demonstrate that you have all the required knowledge, skills and behaviours to qualify as a Level 3 Early Years Educator.

You will develop your knowledge via the Learning Hub and through the completion of the activities, quizzes, activities and assessment tasks. These will also count towards your off-the-job hours.

Each unit will provide either a video tutorial on the topic or a power point session. Each unit will have at least one quiz to test the impact of the new knowledge you have learnt.

There is an End Point Assessment unit to help prepare you for the Knowledge Test, which is made up of Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs).

You can test your knowledge through completing a practice test online through the Learning Hub.
